

## Argentina, the Other Immigrant Experience

In the first three decades of the twentieth century immigration to Argentina soared as wave upon wave of European immigrants from Spain, Italy, England Ireland, France, and to a lesser extent Germany and Russia, arrived in Buenos Aires. These émigrés were responsible for laying the foundation of a wealthy, modern, and cosmopolitan culture that would redefine European aesthetics in Latin America, similar in many regards to what occurred almost concurrently in the United States. We will be partnering with InSitu Programs based in Buenos Aires for this KCAI faculty led travel program and through assigned readings, visits to museums and monuments, and numerous cultural activities and experiences, students will gain a solid understanding of Argentina's immigrant experience, its parallels with the cultural development of the United States, and ultimately its impact on the growth of Latin American art and architecture.

Through the generosity of the Blitt family, KCAI would like to announce the Rita and Irwin Blitt Scholarship for International Travel. Students who are accepted into the summer 2018 faculty-led travel program to Buenos Aires, Argentina will be eligible to apply for funding to cover travel expenses.
