## Critical Sites of Socially Engaged Art and Art Activism

Art history elective (3 hrs)

- Taught by Dr. Izabel Galliera, associate professor of art history at UMKC
- Pre-trip online meeting to orient you to the course and historical context
- Readings on socially engaged art from the 1990s to today
- Visits to museums, galleries, and artist studios in Budapest
- Final project: proposal for an ideal exhibition of socially engaged art





#### Artist-Advocate-Adventurer

Studio elective (3 hrs)

- Taught by Rebecca Blocksome, social practice program head at KCAI
- Designed to maximize experiential learning
- Independent volunteer work with community partners
- Weekly class discussion and reflection
- Final project: visual journal & public presentation at KCAI

# Language & Culture


- Five hours of language & cultural instruction per week
